Visual Art: Dried Flowers

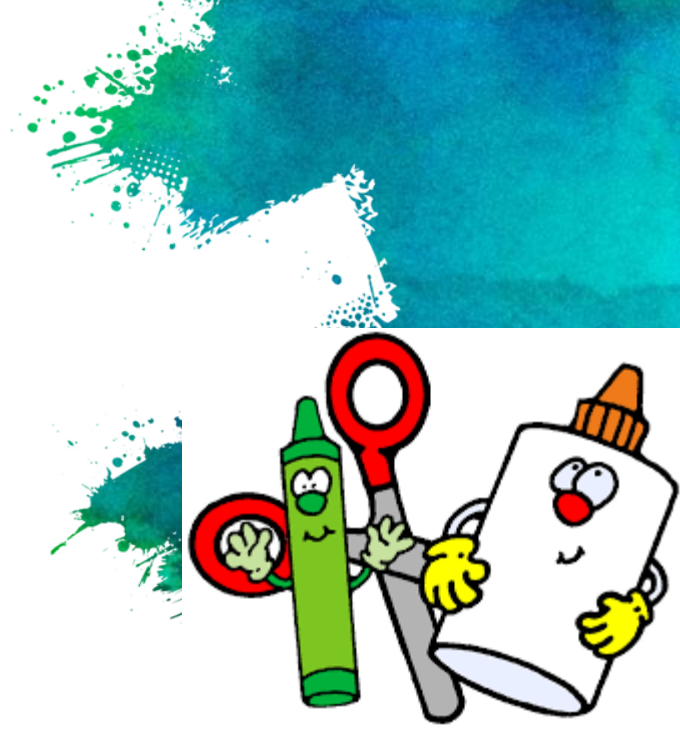
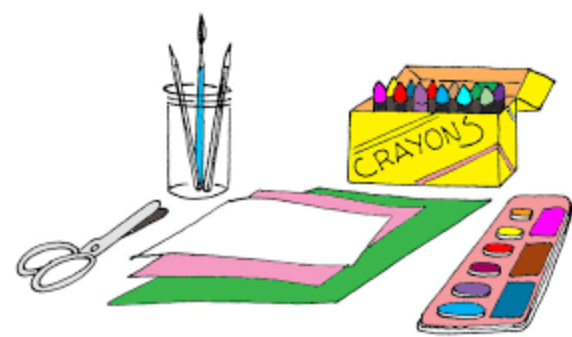
- ❖ This week for art we are going to use real flowers that have been dried to make a pretty picture.

Materials Needed:

- Books (big, heavy ones work best)
- Flowers, petals, leaves, weeds
- Paper/newspaper
- Glue
- White or coloured paper (optional)
- Tape (optional)
- Sticky contact paper/plastic (optional)



Step 1: Off on a nature walk we go...

- Ms. Fitzpatrick has been busy this week picking flowers, petals and leaves to make her own dried flower picture... (ssshhh don't tell her mum!!!)
- It is important to ask permission if you are using flowers from someone's garden but there are plenty of flowers, leaves and weeds to gather on a walk around your estate, park, or garden (within safe distancing and 2km of your house of course).



Step 2: Drying the flowers you have gathered



- Place one of the flowers or some of the leaves (depending on the size of the book you are using) inside a page of a book. If you don't want to mark the book place the flowers in some newspaper or other spare paper you have at home.
- You may need to use a few books depending on how many flowers you pick for your picture.
- Once you have placed the flowers inside the books to dry, it works best to place some heavier books or box (anything you can think of) on top of each book you have used.



Step 3: Time to press/dry...

- × It is best to leave your flowers drying inside the books for a few days and can left for a few weeks if you would like to keep the art project going for a while.
- × Once you are happy with how your flowers are looking, take them out of the books.
- × Now you can choose what kind of a picture you would like to make with your dried flowers.



Option 1: Suncatcher

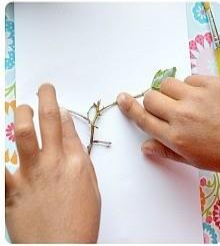
- If you have sticky contact paper (used for covering books/copies) or plastic of some sort that you can stick to the window with sticky tape, then you can make your own dried flower suncatcher.
- It is a nice idea to stick on a window or door with glass as you can see it from both sides.

Option 2: Get creative!



Design your own picture using your flowers using glue.



Make the letter you name begins with make your full name if possible!



Place your flowers and leaves wherever you chose!



Make a card for a family member, friend or frontline worker.

Option 3: Frame it!

- We may not have an actual frame to put our dried flowers in but that doesn't mean we can't make a frame for our picture!
- Or you can use markers, crayons, pencils to colour/decorate your own frame on a piece of paper



- Use any type of pasta you have at home and glue it around the page you have stuck your flowers to. You can paint or dye the pasta if you are feeling very adventurous!!!

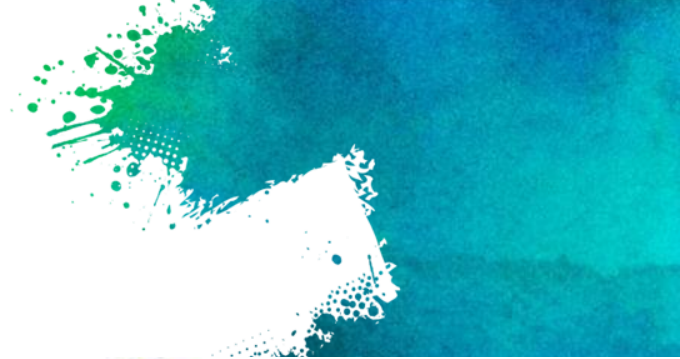
